

Noise Control Engineering Journal Open Access

The Noise Control Engineering Journal (NCEJ) is now offering authors the option of publishing their papers with Open Access. The details of this option are described below. Authors still have the option of publishing with access through the INCE Digital Library or subscriptions at no charge to the author.

Open Access Publication Option for Technical Papers and Case Studies

Authors may choose this option if they wish to have their accepted manuscripts published **open access immediately** upon publication **without** any **embargo period**. Open access might be a requirement of their institutions or research funders, allowing non-subscribers of the journal to access an article free-of-charge.

For this option, authors, their institutions or their research funders are **required** to pay an **Article Publication Charge (APC)** of **\$1,300 or \$1,000 for INCE-USA members**. Receipt of payment is a prerequisite of publishing the article open access immediately upon publication of the respective issue.

All articles are subject to thorough, **independent peer-review**. Authors will only be **asked upon acceptance** of their research papers, if they wish to make use of the open access publication option. Thus, the reviewing and decision process is independent of whether an author will make use of this option, because editors and reviewers are not aware of the author's intention.

Copyright & Open Access License

For articles published open access, authors **retain** the **copyright** to their article, but provide a license to the publisher. All open access articles are published under a **Creative Commons Attribution (CC BY 4.0)**. Creative Commons licenses are irrevocable. This license means that articles can be freely redistributed and reused by the author and others as long as the article is properly cited.

For each article to be published open access, the submitting/corresponding author will need to fill in and sign the **Open Access Agreement** of the journal and return it to the publisher.

What is open access?

Open Access (OA) means that scholarly content can be freely accessed online, independent of a subscription to a journal.

What is the hybrid open access publishing model?

With the hybrid publishing model, a subscription-based journal offers authors the choice to pay for open access publication as an alternative to subscription articles which are without publication fees. Subscription Articles are accessible to individuals or institutions subscribing to the journal, or by pay-per-view. Open Access Articles are freely available online to anyone.

For which articles does a paid open access option apply?

Authors can make use of the immediate open access option for:
Accepted technical papers and case studies.

How much is the article publication charge (APC)?

For technical papers and case studies the open access article publication charge (APC) is \$1,300 (\$1,000 for INCE-USA members).

Is it possible to get a discount or a waiver on the article processing charge (APC)?

Not currently. APCs only apply for open access publication. Any accepted manuscript can alternatively be published as a subscription article without any fees.

Will there be additional fees, if an article contains color images?

There is no additional charge for color figures.

How is it ensured that the payment of an article publication charge by an author has no influence on whether the article is accepted for publication?

Authors will only be asked upon acceptance of their technical papers and case studies, if they wish to make use of the open access publication option. Thus, the reviewing and decision process is independent of whether or not an author wishes to make use of this option. Editors and reviewers are not aware of an author's intention.

When will authors need to decide, if they opt for open access or fast track (open access) publication for their technical paper or case study?

Open Access publication option for technical papers or case studies: Upon acceptance of a manuscript authors will be asked, if they wish to choose paid open access publication. Five working days after receiving the acceptance notification, at the latest, authors must inform the publisher, if they choose this option.

For each article to be published Open Access the submitting/corresponding author needs to fill in and sign the Open Access Agreement. This needs to be done by each author if the contributing author does not have authorization from all authors to do this.

When and how do I need to arrange payment?

For Open Access publication of Technical Papers or Case Studies:

When a submitting/corresponding author informs the publisher on acceptance of his paper that he chooses open access publication, he will be asked to complete an Open Access Agreement which also asks for details in case payment shall be made by an author's institution or research funder on his behalf. Payment can either be made directly by the author online by credit card or with a bill/invoice request. Receipt of payment is a prerequisite of publishing the article open access immediately upon publication of the respective issue. Publication will not occur until payment has been made.

Who retains copyright of an Open Access Article and what license is it published under?

For Open Access Articles and provided an article publication charge (APC) is paid, authors will retain their copyright and provide a license to the publisher. In addition, the submitting/corresponding author will need to print out, fill in and sign the Open Access Agreement of the journal and return it to the publisher. All Open Access Articles are published under a Creative Commons Attribution (CC BY 4.0) which permits unrestricted commercial and non-commercial re-use of an open access article provided the author is properly attributed. Creative Commons licenses are irrevocable.

For articles not published open access (i.e. Subscription Articles) the submitting/corresponding author will need to print out, fill in and sign the exclusive Copyright Transfer Statement for the journal and return it to the publisher.

What can I do with my published Open Access Article?

You can post the final, published PDF of your Open Access Article on your own personal website, your institutional repository, your funder's (designated) repository or on any other free public server, immediately on publication. There is no embargo period.

For articles not published open access (i.e. Subscription Articles) the Copyright and Self-Archiving Policy applies.

What can others do with my published Open Access Article?

All Open Access Articles are published under a Creative Commons Attribution (CC BY 4.0). Creative Commons licenses are irrevocable.

Others can (i) share: copy and redistribute the material in any medium or format, (ii) adapt: remix, transform, and build upon the material for any purpose, even commercially, under the following terms:

Attribution: appropriate credit must be given, a link to the license must be provided, and it must be indicated, if changes were made. This may be done in any reasonable manner, but not in any way that suggests the licensor endorses the other or his/her use.

How will readers know which articles are available open access?

On the journal's hosting platform, your article will be marked as "OA". In addition, your article will have the following note both in print and online: Reuse allowed by a CC-BY 4.0 license, see creativecommons.org/licenses/by/4.0/ (human readable summary).
